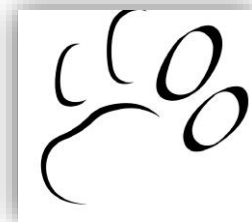

THIS IS A UNIQUE TRAINING OPPORTUNITY, COMBINING CLASSROOM AND HANDS-ON LEARNING WITH A VARIETY OF LIVESTOCK, INCLUDING COWS, PIGS, HORSES, GOATS, SHEEP, AND POULTRY THAT WILL BE BROUGHT TO THE 4-H CENTER. HIGHWAY CRASH RESPONSE VEHICLE WILL BE ON-SITE AS WELL.

THIS TRAINING PROGRAM IS DESIGNED TO ELEVATE THE HUMANE, PROPER AND BIO-SECURE RESPONSE TO FARM ANIMAL EMERGENCIES, AND TO IDENTIFY THE ORGANIZATIONS THAT ARE CAPABLE OF APPROPRIATELY HOUSING FARM ANIMALS AS A RESULT OF CRUELTY SEIZURES, EMERGENCIES, AND NATURAL DISASTERS.

COURSE OVERVIEW – Registration Form

This course is designed to not only prepare the student for an organized and safe response to farm animal emergencies, whether they occur on a highway or on a farm, but also to help students better prepare their facilities for the proper housing of certain livestock in the event of a short or long-term emergency. This course also prepares first responders in identifying the organizations agencies needed to assist in the emergency transport, removal and housing of animals in emergencies.

Interested organizations have the option of being part of the PAACC Farm Animal Safe Landing Program by ensuring their facility meets the minimum criteria for housing specific species of animals. Students will be given a checklist of criteria for basic husbandry of the species they are willing and able to house if needed.

Class begins at 8:30AM and concludes at 4:00PM each day.

CLASSROOM TOPICS INCLUDE:

Organizational Response, Regulatory Authorities, Disaster Response, Highway Incidents Involving Livestock, Disease Management/Reportable Diseases, Transportation Requirements, Disaster Plans and Response, Short and Long-Term Housing of Livestock in Emergencies, and much more.

SPECIES-SPECIFIC AND HANDS-ON TOPICS INCLUDE:

Each species of common Livestock emergency response will be broken down into four categories, including: **Basic Species Husbandry, Safe Capture, Transportation, and Housing in Emergency Situations.**
